

Project Options

- Solicited Bids from Ten Providers
- Seven Responded and Four Provided Bids
- Bids Organized and Reviewed
- Submitted Questions and Interviewed Leading Candidates
- Determined Two Lead Candidates
- Conducting Discovery and Finalizing Anticipated Expenses and Scope of Project
- \$230,000 in 1991 dollars would be \$560K in 2025 at 2.57% inflation (dredge only)
- Estimated Expense: \$700,000 to \$900,000 for all Phases

Dredging and Sediment Removal Solution Options

Mechanical Excavation

- Excavator
- Dozer
- Stage sediment in a pile
- Dump truck haul off

Dredging and Sediment Removal Solution Options (cont.)

Portable Sediment Removal System (Board Recommendation)

- Hydraulic boat placed in lake
- Pumps sediment in a pipeline to containment bags
- Bags dewater
- Soil to be repurposed or hauled off

Phases of Restoration

- 2025 Shoreline Prep
 - Planning, Prep, and Assessment
- 2026 Phase I Restoration: Sediment Removal and Placement
 - Begin Sediment Removal and Placement for Drying
- 2027 Phase II Restoration: Sediment Removal (if needed), and Restoration
 - Additional Sediment Removal, Removing Dry Sediment, Placement for Drying of New Sediment
- 2028 Restoration
 - Terracing, Planting, and Restoration
